

# Who We Serve

During the 2020-21 school year, Reading Assist worked in partnership with several schools in New Castle and Kent Counties to identify and serve children in kindergarten to third grade who score in the lowest 10% for reading proficiency.

We recruited 31 AmeriCorps members – known as Reading Assist Fellows – to commit a school year of service to provide our accredited one-on-one intervention program to some of Delaware's most struggling readers.
