A Letter From Our CEO



Dear Friends and Supporters,

Strong readers aren't built by schools alone. They thrive when they're given the specialized, evidence-based support they need, wherever learning happens. At Reading Assist, we've long believed that every child deserves access to high-quality literacy instruction, whether it's in the classroom during the school day, after school, or throughout the summer. This year, we continued to expand that support across our region.

In 2025–26, Reading Assist served over 2,300 students across 70+ partner schools and community sites in Washington, D.C., Delaware, Pennsylvania, and this year, New Jersey. While expanding into a fourth state and growing our reach into Philadelphia, we also strengthened the foundation of our work by deepening school partnerships, expanding professional learning for educators, growing relationships with community partners, and advancing evidence-based literacy through advocacy.

We celebrated the graduation of the first Tutors to Teachers Delaware cohort, preparing the next generation of educators with training in the Science of Reading. We continued to invest in schools through professional learning and coaching while working alongside policymakers and partners to advance evidence-based literacy across our region. Most importantly, 90% of Reading Assist students reached benchmark levels in at least one foundational reading skill—a testament to the dedication of our Fellows, staff, and school partners.

While we're proud of what we've accomplished together, we know the work is far from finished. Too many children still lack access to the literacy support they need to thrive. But this year reaffirmed what we know to be true: when students receive the high-quality, individualized literacy support they need, they learn to read. Every child deserves that opportunity.

Thank you for being part of the Reading Assist community. Whether you served as a Fellow, partnered with us, volunteered your time, invested in our mission, or championed literacy in your own community, you helped make this year possible.

Together, we're building stronger readers, stronger communities, and brighter futures.

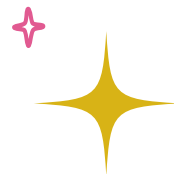

Why Reading Assist Works



HIGH-IMPACT, EVIDENCE-BASED INSTRUCTION – Reading Assist delivers high-impact, evidence-based literacy support through direct student instruction, professional learning for educators, and school-based coaching. Whether working one-on-one or in small groups, our trained instructors use the accredited Reading Assist program, a structured literacy curriculum grounded in the Orton-Gillingham approach.

DATA-DRIVEN – Reading Assist measures student growth using Acadience Reading K–6, a nationally recognized assessment of critical foundational reading skills. Students complete benchmark assessments three times throughout the school year, along with weekly progress monitoring. Our Program staff review progress data weekly to make data-driven adjustments to each student's tutoring and reading goals.

HIGH-QUALITY TRAINING AND COACHING SUPPORT – Reading Assist invests in the people who make literacy growth possible. Reading Assist Fellows, educators, and community partners receive intensive training in structured literacy and ongoing coaching from our experienced program team. This layered support ensures consistent, high-quality implementation while helping schools build lasting capacity to support young readers.

COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS – Reading Assist partners with schools, colleges and universities, community organizations, and government leaders to expand access to literacy support. Collaborations with organizations like CitySchools Collaborative, Read by 4th, United Way, and the YMCA help connect more students and families with the resources they need to thrive.

CONTRIBUTING TO THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION

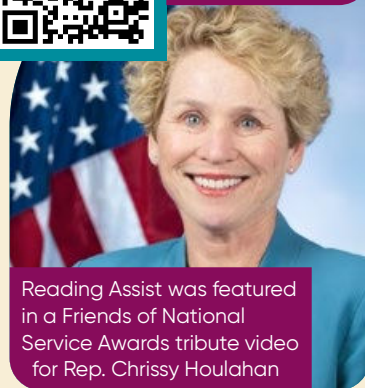

INVESTING IN EDUCATORS ALREADY IN THE CLASSROOM

Reading Assist expanded professional learning opportunities through partnerships with Brandywine School District, Red Clay Consolidated School District, and Academia Antonia Alonso Charter School. Brandywine educators participated in Science of Reading professional learning, while Red Clay and La Academia partnered with Reading Assist to implement its Literacy Leaders coaching model. Together, these partnerships supported more than 50 educators this year with practical, evidence-based strategies that strengthen literacy instruction and build lasting school capacity.

Connecting Literacy and Community



HIGHLIGHTS

Literacy grows when communities come together. From corporate volunteers to neighborhood organizations, our partners helped expand access to books, learning opportunities, and meaningful experiences for students and families.

POWERED BY PARTNERSHIPS

Strong partnerships expand access to literacy. This year, Reading Assist partnered with the City of Wilmington to bring summer literacy programming to the Police Athletic League of Wilmington (PAL) and the William "Hicks" Anderson Community Center. We also joined United Way of Delaware's Get Delaware Reading: Summer initiative and expanded after-school tutoring with the YMCA of Delaware, with support from the Partnership for Student Success (PSS). Together, these partnerships brought high-quality literacy support to students where they learn, play, and grow.

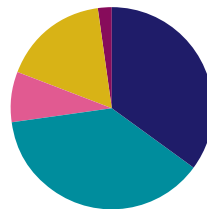
