



What We Do

- Reading Assist provides year-round highdosage tutoring services to children with the most significant reading challenges, prioritizing support to low-income students, students of color, and multilingual learners.
- We recruit and train **AmeriCorps members**, known as **Reading Assist Fellows**, to work 1:1 and in small groups 3–5 times per week with struggling readers.
- We provide additional support to students through our **summer and after-school programs**.
- We offer training and certification to teachers, reading specialists, and other educators who wish to increase their understanding and knowledge of the science of reading.

82% of children from low-income households lack reading proficiency by 3rd grade

74% of struggling readers won't catch up after 3rd grade

greater likelihood of dropping out of high school (poor readers nationwide)



We serve children across Delaware and in Chester, PA, in kindergarten through third grade in the lowest 25% for reading proficiency, with priority given to low-income students, students of color, and multilingual learners.
